## Young at Art Virtual Juried Exhibit 2026

Please follow the steps below to submit student artworks. **IMPORTANT: We are not responsible for any incorrectly submitted works.** We highly encourage teachers to start the submission process early, so that there may be time for corrections prior to judging.

Step 1: Complete the <u>Young At Art Teacher Registration Form</u> by **January 16, 2026**. You will then be given access to a Google Drive folder to complete the submission process.

Step 2: Work with your students on creating art works in compliance with the following rules:

- 1. Submitted works must be original works by the student(s). Use of any licensed and/or copyrighted imagery will be disqualified. Group works are permissible.
- 2. Maximum of 1 individual entry per student. Students with an individual entry may also be included in 1 group entry. Group entries should be a collaborative work.
- 3. Pieces may be any medium, two-dimensional (drawings, paintings, flat collages, weavings, photographs, etc.) or three- dimensional (ceramics, sculptures, jewelry, dioramas, etc.)
- 4. Pieces must be less than 20 lbs and no more than 24" x 30"
- 5. Please encourage students to title their artwork.
- 6. Each submission should connect to the exhibit theme, "SHIFT." Artist statements (up to 250 words) are highly encouraged and included in the judging process.

Step 3: Photograph and upload the entries via the Google Drive folder provided to you.

- 1. Photography guidelines:
  - a. Resolution of at least 72 DPI
  - b. No backlight or shadows
  - c. White tone of light, if possible
  - d. Crop for minimal background
- 2. Photo file names should include:
  - a. Student's name
  - b. Grade
  - c. Title of work
- 3. For 3D pieces, multiple angles may be submitted and labeled "View 1", "View 2", etc.

Step 5: Complete the Young At Art Entry Sheet in your Google Drive folder.

Step 6: Email <u>youngatarthawaii@gmail.com</u> when all steps have been completed by **Saturday**, **January 24**, **2026 at 12:00pm**.

Step 7: If your students' artworks are accepted:

- 1. You will be sent a notification that includes a day, time, and location for physical intake of artworks.
- 2. Prior to intake, mount/mat 2D works with white or neutral heavy weight paper or mats. Do not frame in wood, metal, plastic or glass unless it is a vital part of the display.
- 3. Stretched canvas artworks should have a hanging wire.
- 4. Label the artwork in an inconspicuous area with the following:
  - a. Student's name
  - b. Title of Work
  - c. School
